

## “What Comes Down Must Go Up” — Survival Secrets From the Sukkah

We can learn lessons of resiliency from the humble sukkah. This portable, collapsible shelter is mandated by the Torah as a dwelling for Jews during the Festival of Sukkot. The Sukkah’s roof must *not* be attached to the supporting boards. Most sukkot have an appearance and feel of being somewhat rickety. A good wind can take off the roof. In many sukkot, the structure itself is subject to collapse or blowing over in a stiff wind. This fragility is one of the points of the sukkah. Many commentators take this as an object lesson in humility, the fragility of life, or our dependence on G-d. All of these are cogent points, but, to me not the key point. I believe the most important lesson of the sukkah is: “What comes down must go up.” What do you do if your sukkah falls down and it is not Shabbat? You put it back up! The Torah tells us that our ancestors “dwelt in sukkoth when they left Egypt.” Anyone familiar with the travels of the Israelites knows that they went from place to place. Each time they left one place, the sukkoth came down and when they encamped again, the sukkoth went up again. Even G-d’s house, the *Mishkan*, was disassembled and reassembled and in between, carried in pieces along the way.

Life is a journey. Even when things seem settled, change is all around us. To succeed in life does not mean to be perfect, to never make mistakes or to be so cautious that one avoids all troubles. **The key to long-term success is resilience.** When we find the strength to “carry



the pieces” to the next encampment, as it were, and reassemble them, or, as with the sukkot in our homes today, to put back up what falls down, we find that we can prevail and even thrive. The Rabbis nudge us towards this interpretation of life as a sukkah in the special passage for Sukkot, recited in the Birkat HaMazon, the Grace After Meals: “*HaRachaman Hu Yakim Lanu et Sukat David HaNofalet.*” “May the All Merciful raise for us the fallen sukkah of David.” What comes down must go up, whether it is the Royal House of David leading to the Messianic Age, the sukkah in my backyard after a windy night, or a person struggling with job loss, family conflict or the death of a loved one. We ask G-d’s help to find the strength and conviction to “put the roof back on,” to carry the pieces ahead and rebuild. This spirit, perhaps more than any other, has characterized our people through many many centuries of joy and adversity. When other ancient peoples have vanished, the Jews have, thank G-d, persevered. Maybe this is why our Sages call Sukkot “*The Holiday.*” Because the collapsible and rebuildable sukkah embodies this key teaching.

It is worth noting that Sukkot is a festival of maximum rejoicing. How are we able to be joyful when the roof may fall off at any minute? Precisely. Life is unpredictable. Our best laid plans may go off the rails. Therefore, seek joy in every moment. Live each day to its fullest, and when it does fall, we help each other put the sukkah back up again.

Moadim Lesimcha — best wishes for a joyful and resilient Sukkot.

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE — *LIVING LONGER: BELONGING TO THE RIGHT TRIBE*..... by Alan S. Parker

As I was preparing for my Kol Nidre address to the congregation, I came across an interesting essay by Rabbi Rami M. Shapiro who wrote about a patent for a “life expectancy timepiece,” a watch with a computer chip that calculates your statistical life expectancy.



Here’s how it works: you enter your age, medical history, life-style, eating habits and exercise regime. The timepiece calculates your remaining life expectancy — for example: 36 years, 240 days, 19 hours and 12 minutes and 6 seconds. And it then begins to count down from your life expectancy to zero, second by second.

So would you want to look at your wrist and see such a countdown? Would you find it depressing or uplifting? Would it remind you of the importance of living in the moment? Appreciating each and every day? Would you be more likely to engage in acts of loving-kindness, social justice, charity and good deeds? Would you be bothered less by insignificant problems? Would you be more inspired by the teachings of Judaism?

This concept and the timepiece’s “lifestyle” input reminded me of the “Blue Zone” scientific studies of various areas around the globe with an unusually high percentage of centenarians. The study focused on determining common denominators for “living longer, and younger.”

The study of those who lived longer and younger showed that one main denominator category is “belonging to the right tribe.” The study showed that those who lived longer and younger surrounded themselves with the right people (i.e. a healthy social network), made an effort to connect or re-connect with religion, and put loved ones first.

And if you take a “Blue Zone” quiz to determine your “Blue Zone” life expectancy, you will be asked, “How often do you attend religious activities?”

I am pretty sure you will agree with me that we “belong to the right tribe.” At the Emanuel, there are countless ways for you to connect or re-connect to your religion and belong to a healthy social network. The Blue Zone study may give you an added incentive to do one or more of the following:

- Make a commitment this year to regularly attend a Minyan service (e.g once a week, twice a month, the first Tuesday of each month, etc.). You will belong to a healthy, supportive network with those

who are in a period of mourning, observing a Yahrzeit, or connecting to Judaism.

- Volunteer to be on an Emanuel committee or task force. You will have an opportunity to interact with other members of your tribe and you will be awarded with a sense of purpose.
- Come to Shabbat services. Join forces with other members of your tribe seeking a spiritual connection.

For the sake of developing your own Blue Zone, the Emanuel offers you the opportunity connect with your religion in whatever way you desire.

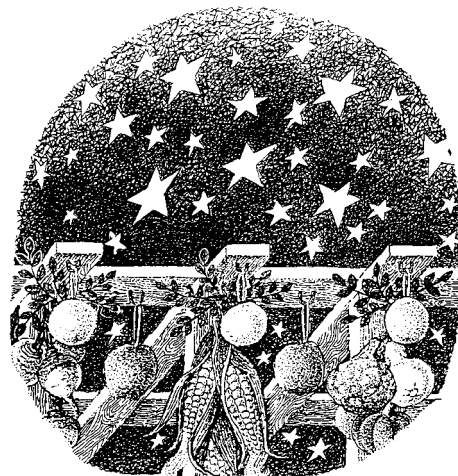

## NOTES FROM THE CANTOR

### CANTORS ASSEMBLY MISSION TO POLAND — JUNE-JULY, 2009 — PART II

On Friday morning we took a Jewish heritage sightseeing tour of Krakow. After driving through the former site of the Krakow ghetto, we arrived at Oskar Schindler's earthenware factory, made famous in the 1993 movie *Schindler's List* and turned into a museum just this year. While it's not a huge attraction, we all appreciated the great deeds of this man who saved approximately 1,200 Jews from meeting their deaths.

Even more poignant was the "Plaza of the Empty Chairs." Because many people were photographed carrying chairs as they moved from their homes to the ghetto, these simple pieces of furniture came to symbolize the forced migration. Several empty chairs permanently installed on the plaza make for a very fitting tribute to the memory of the many residents of Krakow who perished in the Shoah. We then proceeded to the Kazimierz district. Even though fewer than 200 Jews now live in Krakow, this area is still known as the Jewish Quarter.

There is a large plaza surrounded by restaurants, several specializing in Jewish food, and one is actually certified as Kosher. There seems to be an amazing fascination with Jewish culture in Poland, especially in Krakow, which was a major center of Jewish life for centuries before World War II. Our trip coincided with the 19th annual Festival of Jewish Music, a weeklong series of concerts and workshops featuring musicians, predominantly *klezmerim*, that culminated with a *Havdala* service featuring many of our *hazzanim* in front of about 15,000 people.

Our tour concluded with a visit to the Remu'h Synagogue, built in 1557, the only one in the city that still



functions regularly. The Synagogue is named after Moses Isserlis Remu'h, the son of the founder, who studied in Lublin and became a famous rabbi and scholar. Behind it is an ancient cemetery containing his grave and those of other famous rabbis of the last few centuries.

On Friday evening, before Shabbat, our entire delegation of over 300 gathered at the Izaak Synagogue for a beautiful Shabbat dinner. After an impromptu rehearsal in the courtyard outside, we proceeded to The Tempel (Progressive) Synagogue. This is certainly the largest in town, but the service that evening was standing room only, with the crowd pouring out into the street. The *t'filot* were led by several of my cantorial colleagues as the rest of us sang choral responses in a variety of musical styles.

The following morning we were treated to the dawning of two of my best known colleagues, Hazzanim Jacob Mendelson of White Plains, N.Y., and Alberto Mizrahi of Chicago. It's a rare CA convention in which we can hear these beautiful voices in actual Shabbat services.

On Sunday, July 5, the final full day of the convention/pilgrimage, the main event was a concert at the Krakow Philharmonic Hall entitled "An American Songbook in Honor of Independence Day." Eleven cantors presented a beautiful performance of American standards and theater music written by Jewish composers who had ties to Poland.

All in all, I found this trip to be inspirational on several different levels. As with all CA conventions, it was so important and worthwhile to connect with colleagues, some for the first time, both professionally and personally. Visiting Poland, once a true center of European Jewry, was bittersweet. One is constantly reminded of what was, and what should have been if not for Hitler. On the other hand, we witnessed a rebuilding and reawakening of Jewish life that has especially increased since the fall of Communism. I have faith that the Polish people, both Jews and non-Jews, will continue to work towards enhancing Jewish life in their country and will continue to be a loyal friend to the state of Israel. Many thanks to the congregation for sponsoring my trip. *Hag Sukot Sameah.*
