FROM THE RABBI WHAT STAYS AND WHAT GOES?



In July, I had the opportunity to drive to Chicago to visit family and friends. One of my friends, Debra, is a colleague who leads a congregation on the North Shore. Talking in her back yard, we reflected on the many adjustments the pandemic has brought to synagogue life. Rabbi Debra

observed, "One of the big decisions we need to make on many levels is what stays and what goes."

At first, we discussed the need to adapt the High Holy Day service to a streamed or Zoom environment. Attention spans are shorter online. If people wish, they can pad to the fridge in their slippers and grab a cold drink or a snack in the middle of the service, which some may consider a perk; however, the drama and intensity of an in-person immersive experience is missing. We agreed a shorter service would help keep people focused and engaged. The choices of how to omit and what to retain present both a challenge and an opportunity. We wish to provide a familiar and reassuring experience, especially when so much of our world is in flux. At the same time, emergency circumstances open up the possibility of trying new approaches to a degree that would be unheard of in usual times. We must ask ourselves: "What stays and what goes?"

As we sat and talked in the warm, late afternoon light, the question expanded and blossomed before our eyes from a practical, liturgical problem — an exercise in "schulcraft" — to an existential question that penetrates to the essence of our being — a matter of "soulcraft." Every year we are meant to face ourselves and ask this very question: "What stays and what goes?" What of our lives is cherished, healthy and positive? This we must embrace and increase. What of our lives is empty, devoid of meaning, hurtful, misguided, is leading us down the wrong path? This must go. In a life lived at a high degree of accountability and integrity, it would be best to pose the questions daily. Yet the day-to-day routine can dull our spiritual senses. The power of habit can help us maintain a good and upright path or can mire us in a revolving door of missed opportunities, of spiritual and emotional numbness that is tough to escape. The High Holy Days, or "Ten Days of Repentance — Aseret Yemai

In other exciting news, our Rabbinical Intern **Jessica Dell'Era** will be continuing as the Rabbinical Intern at The Emanuel, now under the auspices of JTS's Resnick Internship program. The program gives fourth-year JTS rabbinical students in-depth experience and mentoring, along with a weekly

class to process field experiences and gain community organizing skills. This year, Jessica will continue her previous roles — including leading services for children and adults, divrei Torah and learning — and will additionally become more involved in organizational and life cycle activities.

Prior to moving east for rabbinical school, Jessica served for many years as a bilingual public school educator and Hebrew school teacher/Bnai Mitzvah tutor. She holds a M.A. in Education from the University of California Berkeley and a B.A. in Dramaturgy from Pomona College. She is currently completing her M.A. in Sacred Music at JTS and fills her spare time with creative pursuits like, art, music, gardening and crochet.

HaTeshuvah" as expressed by our Sages, is designed to awaken personal and communal urgency around these ultimate questions. These days, if embraced to the fullest, offer us collective energy to grapple with the work before us: "What stays and what goes?"

Rabbi Alan Lew, of blessed memory, writes in his riveting book, *This is Real and You are Totally Unprepared*, that the main image of *Neilah*, that the Gates of Repentance are closing, applies not only on *Yom HaKippurim*, but every day, every moment. Like the valves of our heart opening and shutting every moment, the Gates of Judgement open and close constantly. If we were aware, we could carry out Teshuvah every day, any day. The power of Yom Kippur lies in our awareness of this fact. This intense period of self-judgement, if we focus upon it with true openness, can lead us to change, repair and new life (*TIRAYATU*: Ch. 10, The Gates Clang Shut).

As we approach the Awesome Days, ask yourself, "What stays and what goes?" We have the chance to confront and correct mistakes, forgive each other and ourselves, and apply ourselves to the hard, good work of growth and repair. The pandemic has blown up our status quo. The crisis is not our choice, but if we choose, we can seize the opportunity to change ourselves and our world for the better.


EMANUEL SYNAGOGUE HOUSE COMMITTEE REPORT – JULY 2020

- Construction has started on **Fire Code improvements** in the Religious School wing.
- **Solar Power**. The portion of the Auditorium roof facing South (17 years old, shingle, double layer) must be replaced. Anticipated payback of costs is less than two years of operation.
- Auditorium Air Conditioning Compressor Failure. The large (50 ton) compressor, which dates back to 1955, has failed, and must be rebuilt or replaced, depending upon parts availability. The House Committee budget contains \$20,000 for emergency air conditioning repairs. However, the cost could be considerably more to replace the cooling system with modern and efficient equipment.
- NAA Neighborhood Assistance Act application has been submitted. When (and if) the project receives approval from the State of CT, The Emanuel must reach out to companies who are subject to State Income Tax, for funding. Last year we received major funds from Keystone Leasing and Avangrid (Gas Utility Company) towards the school roof replacement. Thank you again.
- Building Reopening House Committee is working with our Executive Director and the various Committees to ensure safe and sanitary conditions for the time when our Synagogue can be safely reopened for our students and members.
- Bathroom Renovations House Committee has received many complaints about the women's restrooms condition. Special attention is being focused on making the bathrooms more accessible, with larger and additional stalls, and more modern decor. A budget will be established for future funding of design and construction work.
- Thank you to the Arts Committee for their help in the beautiful window design and renovation of the Beth Hillel area of the school/library building.

FUTURE PROJECTS:

- We are looking for a vendor to put in **additional** railings on Bema.
- Areas of refuge Locking hardware has been installed. Emergency Supplies and Equipment requirements to be determined.
- Parking Lot Repairs Re-scheduled for summer 2021. Scope to be determined.
- Rear Walk Replacement With Pavers and Engraved Bricks approved by Board Future Fundraiser need chairperson.



- Repair of Exterior Yellow Bricks on Outside of Auditorium.
- Domestic hot water loop temperature is erratic, and although it was investigated several times, no solution has been found. Possible need for mechanical engineer to diagnose and recommend changes.
- Thank you House Committee members Rick Lasker, Alan Goodman, David Epstein, Kirk Hipps, and head custodian Joseph Ward, for your help. Also, welcome to our new Executive Director, Kobi Benita.
