FROM THE RABBI

JOURNEYS

The year was 1984. A rabbinical student, one of our classmates, invited a teacher of his to an informal gathering in Goldsmith Hall, a block from JTS in New York. Jeff felt that our training was so academic in focus that some spiritual enrichment was required. The guest was a rabbi and teacher of *kabbalah*. I do not recall his name, but I remember one thing he said: "Life is a *maholokh*, a way of going. *Halakhab*, Jewish law is from the same *shoresh* (root) to walk a path. When we view mitzvot as a static group of rules, we miss the big picture. Life is a way of being. Mitzvot are direction signs that guide us on our way. The essence of life's meaning is to discover our path in life and to make the journey."

When Estelle Kafer approached me several years ago and invited me to help lead a Jewish Historical Society trip to Eastern Europe, in 2010, I was intrigued, even excited at the prospect, but a corner of my heart was also filled with dread. I had been to Poland once before, but never to Auschwitz and Birkenau. How could my heart bear the anguish of walking among the ashes of the Six Million? Yad Vashem in Jerusalem was intense enough; this would be a visit to the murder site itself. To what purpose?

My first answer is *K'vod Hamet*, honoring the dead. As is traditional, I will bring small stones with me to mark the visit and say prayers remembering the dead. Second, I intend to use this opportunity to acquire a more personal sense of the places they lived, and the way they lived, to take on their stories, to make their memory more real inside my soul. Accompanied by Professor Sam Kassow, our group will visit Warsaw, Krakow, Prague and Budapest. We will pray the Shabbat service where the great Maharal studied, we will gain greater consciousness not only of how our forebearers died, but how they lived. In some as yet undefined way, I sense that this trip is an important step on my life's *maholokh*, my own journey, a strand woven into our people's journey across space and time.

I wish each member of our Emanuel Family a meaningful, enjoyable summer. I look forward to sharing stories upon my return. Please stop by the shul to welcome our new Executive Director, Laurie Leader. Laurie's many abilities, kind heart and her deep understanding of the purpose of a synagogue will help us rise to new heights together.

NOTES FROM THE CANTOR

AN EXCITING OPPORTUNITY FOR TEENS

HaZamir is the International Jewish High School Choir that was created by Matthew Lazar to provide Jewish teens with a high level choral experience in a Jewish environment. Local HaZamir chapters exist in cities across the United States and Israel. Each HaZamir chapter meets weekly in its own city to rehearse Jewish choral music. Although each HaZamir chapter is autonomous in its own city, there is a body of music that all HaZamirs learn so that they can perform together at the HaZamir annual Festival.



I am pleased to announce that I am collaborating with my friend and colleague, Cantor Joseph Ness of Beth El Temple, to begin a Hartford area chapter of HaZamir. We are in talks with both the Mandell JCC and Yachad to explore areas in which we can partner in this exciting project. The following information is taken from the website of the Zamir Choral Foundation. Ours will be the 20th chapter from around the U.S. and Israel.

HaZamir provides Jewish high school-age teens the unique opportunity to gather together, sing Jewish choral music, build community and connect culturally. By providing a high-quality, structured program, HaZamir's unique experience helps foster a lifelong commitment to Jewish culture and music in young people, and builds a strong foundation for future Jewish involvement among its participants. HaZamir spans the denominations, giving young people an



all-too-rare trans-denominational experience, forging close bonds and transcending the boundaries that so often separate.

In addition to local and regional performances, HaZamir sponsors regional retreats, where chapters meet, rehearse together, and grow in friendship. The HaZamir Annual Festival brings chapters and participants from each HaZamir across the country and Israel for a two-day festival, culminating in a gala concert at a major venue in New York City. Individuals, many of whom sing, but not in a Jewish choir or context, attend and find an entrance to a Jewish choral experience. HaZamir alumni return and perform at the Festival, and a select group of teen singers of a higher ability perform in the HaZamir Chamber Choir. The gala performance, in particular, brings together music, Judaism, community and spirituality in a powerful blend that can be nothing short of life-changing.

In the 16 years of its existence,

more than 1,000 teens have shared in the HaZamir experience. Many have gone on to form a cappella groups, sing in adult choirs, and assume leadership roles in the Jewish community. Clearly, HaZamir has helped reach an emotional core in young people; our belief is that participation in HaZamir lays an important foundation for continuing Jewish values later in life, as well as offering the ability to meet challenges and develop personal skills within a communal context. Our goal is to expand the HaZamir network, to help build the next generations of Jewish adults with a deeper understanding of the values, tradition and glory of Judaism and artistic expression.

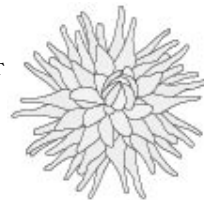

JEFFREY RUDOLPH'S ISRAELI DEFENSE FORCE MILITARIA ON VIEW

Be sure to view the new exhibit in the Rose, David and Ralph Mittenick cases opposite the sanctuary. Jeffrey Rudolph's Israeli Defense Force Militaria's collection numbers over 300 shoulder tags, 12 berets, several hundred lapel pins, and 50 Air Force jacket patches. Consequently, the current display contains only a portion of this collection.

Each service unit of the Israeli Armed Forces has its own unique shoulder tag, and is worn on the left shoulder. Prior to being worn by the members of the forces, the tags are trimmed along the guidelines. Some have animals, artillery pieces, landscapes and airplanes. Each beret represents a different unit, and are in different colors. Olive green, red, blue and black berets are featured. Tags represent the Army, Air Force, Navy, Artillery Transport and Intelligence.

Rudolph is a collector of many things. His interests include stamps,

coins, paper money and Israel antiques. He also has a great deal of material about Arthur Szyk, who was a world-renowned painter of miniatures, illustrations and caricatures. Adolph Hitler was so displeased with Szyk's caricature of him and other anti-Nazi drawings during World War II that he offered a \$50,000 reward for Szyk's capture. Many of these collections have been in the Emanuel cases in the past years.

This exhibit corresponded with a special "Israeli Discovery Day" held during the middle of May. Sponsored by the Emanuel Religious School of which Ms. Judy Fox is Executive Director, and the B'yadenu Committee, of which Ms. Risa Davidson is Chairperson, the day was a great success. Students of all ages participated. Israeli food was prepared and served by the Brotherhood under the direction of Saul Shemkovitz and his committee. Culinary items included Israeli

salads, couscous, falafel and drinks. Shemkovitz's committee included Alan Berkowitz, Richard Nabel, Don Miller, Al Fichman and Jeff Rudolph.

The Israeli Defense Force Militaria will remain in the cases throughout the summer until the beginning of the High Holiday season. The work of a new local sculptor, Rabbi Harold S. Silver, Rabbi Emeritus of Congregation Beth Israel will be shown. Rabbi Silver works in limestone, alabaster and marble. He did not begin stone sculpture until his retirement at the age of eighty, and in February 2008, he won first place for his alabaster sculpture of "Bathsheba" in the Sculpture Exhibition at the Longboat Key Center for the Arts. The new exhibit will feature 12 pieces, a remarkable number for a new artist. Now 86, Rabbi Silver's passion for sculpting continues to grow.

Jewish people and the sharing of food is a pairing as natural as a lock and key or a pen and ink. So it's not surprising that an Emanuel congregant has found a way to repair the world with a meal.

Ori Clare is an IT project manager for a major energy company connected with Connecticut Natural Gas. He also owns a company called Tech-Mech, providing a wide range of services, from home remodeling to computer repair. In addition, he co-owns Enlightened Professionals Network with his wife Robin, promoting the talents of highly skilled healers, teachers and speakers. Free time is scarce, yet he makes time each week to help others.

Ori's weekly commitment is preparing food at a soup kitchen in Hartford. Each Wednesday he uses his lunch hour to prepare and plate

food at Christ Church Cathedral. Between 85 and 125 people show up for hot meals and friendly faces.

"I had served meals at Christmas with the Salvation Army, but wanted to do something on a regular basis to help alleviate poverty. A speaker at a Hartford Jewish Coalition program said that no person will solve all the world's problems, but each of us can work to fix one small thing. He inspired me to look for the thing that I could do."

Ori searched the Internet and found "Hands On Hartford," an organization that matches volunteers with local needs. The site gives options for choosing the type of volunteer work and addresses volunteers' expectations about the work.



"This is one of the highlights of my week. People really appreciate what we do for them. And there's no pressure in this work," Ori says.

Ori's work at the soup kitchen is an example of the mitzvah called "Mazon," feeding the hungry. Though set in a church, it's a Jewish activity for him. "I sign in as a member of Emanuel Synagogue so that non-Jewish beneficiaries will know that the Jewish community cares about them.

We're all part of the same world."

OUR YEAR IN REVIEW:

In response to the increased need for support for our local food pantries this past year, B'Yadenu held four very successful food drives. Our donations supported West Hartford Food Pantry, the Kosher Food Pantry of Hartford Jewish Family Services, Foodshare, Gifts of Love and Shiloh Baptist Church.

For the sixth consecutive year, Chanukah packages were sent to Jewish men and women serving in Iraq, Germany, Korea and Afghanistan. Students in many of the Religious School classes made cards that were included in the packages. The students wrote caring messages, expressing concern for those receiving the packages. Congregational support was incredibly strong yet again this year.

In the early Fall, Ethan Bronner, Jerusalem Bureau Chief for the New York Times spoke at the University of Hartford's Greenberg Center. Bronner is a Pulitzer Prize winning journalist. The event was sponsored by B'Yadenu, Temple Beth El, JFACT and JCRC and was well attended and extremely informative.

On the evening of December 21, an interfaith candlelight vigil was held on St. Joseph's College campus along Asylum Avenue. B'Yadenu members representing our congregation were present at this moving candlelight vigil.

January brought another illustration of the generosity of the Emanuel congregation with the donation of 85 warm winter coats to the South Park Inn. The South Park Inn located in Hartford is a non-denominational shelter serving homeless adults and children.

The Israel Solidarity Committee, a subcommittee of B'Yadenu,

in collaboration with Judy Fox and Grae Sibelman from Religious School held Discover Israel Day on May 23. There were arts and crafts activities, workshops, technology displays, music, dance and Israeli food. All activities focused on Israel its past, present and future. Thank you to the following people who worked so hard on this event for more than a year: Hal Cohen, Risa Davidson, Judy Fox, Tom Fromson, Doris Nabel, Jamie November, Regina Miller, Charles Rotenberg, Jeff Rudolph, Saul Shemkovitz, Grae Sibelman, Bob Tellar, and Janet Wallans. A special thank you goes to Bruce Weiner for his tech support.

Pam Garry, along with other Emanuel synagogue members, lead monthly Friday evening Shabbat services at the Hebrew Home. The residents look forward to these special services. Emanuel participation is warmly received and helps to make services warm-hearted and spirited for both the residents and Emanuel members.

As we have done in the past, B'Yadenu chose the recipients of Rabbi Small's Annual Passover Fund. Recipients must demonstrate operational efficiency and must be making efforts to assist people who are suffering. The following nonprofit organizations were selected this year: 1) Jewish Family Services of Greater Hartford, Kosher Food Pantry; 2) Sar-El, which means "Service for Israel." This non-profit, non-political organization encourages volunteers from around the world to come to Israel to work in I.D. F. warehouses or in nursing homes. Part of their mission is to foster relationships between people in Israel and the diaspora; 3) American Jewish World Service (funds will be allocated to help people in Darfur). AJWS is an international organization dedicated to alleviating poverty, hunger and disease among

the people of the developing world regardless of race, religion or nationality; 4) OXFAM America, an organization that works with over 3,000 local partner organizations on long term projects to eradicate poverty and combat injustice around the globe.

We would like to thank both B'Yadenu members and Israeli Solidarity Committee members for their support, assistance, and participation in the various programs and activities held this past year. 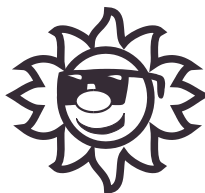
