

FROM THE RABBI *THE ANCIENT CALL TO PRACTICE SOCIAL JUSTICE*

As the first frost dusts the lawns in my neighborhood, the cadences of Yom Kippur still ring in my ears. Isaiah proclaims: "This is my chosen fast:...feed the hungry, clothe the naked, bring the homeless into your homes!" This month, we have an opportunity to make good on the ancient call to practice social justice, proclaimed at roughly the time Homer was spinning the Iliad. Shari Cantor of the Kosher Food Pantry called me recently to ask for help from the local synagogues. "Foodshare will have less to distribute this year, as their demand is up. We estimate at least 50 families will need food for Thanksgiving meals this year, more than double last year's total."



We have made it an Emanuel tradition to contribute to the Lillian Harris Turkey Drive. This year, let us redouble our efforts to supply the hungry of our community with food for Thanksgiving and beyond. Volunteers and staff of the Kosher Food Pantry expressed admiration for the responsiveness of the Emanuel Family during the High Holy Day food drive. Emanuel contributed more bags of non-perishable food items than any other congregation in the area. While turkey is still a Thanksgiving staple at many homes, there are many other healthy items to contribute. These include: canned pumpkin, beans, rice, barley and canned greens and vegetables. made at The Emanuel (back parking lot) on Monday, November 23 from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. or at the Kosher Food Pantry in the Community Services Building across from the JCC. Tell them you are from The Emanuel.

Emanuel contributed more bags of non-perishable food items than any other congregation in the area during the High Holy Days. This year, let us redouble our efforts to supply the hungry of our community with food for Thanksgiving and beyond.

I am asking for a shul-wide effort including every arm of the Emanuel to really come through for the hungry this year. Lay-offs and a slow economy have extended the reality of want into West Hartford and hardened already hard times in Hartford. We must respond. G-d is watching and the hungry are waiting for our action. I am confident in the goodness and activism of our people. Best wishes for a Happy Thanksgiving! *Tizku lemitzvot* — may you merit the reward of further "mitzvah opportunities"!

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE — MY KOL NIDRE ADDRESS WAS INFLUENCED BY AN UNLIKELY SOURCE ...by Alan S. Parker

If you have written an article or a speech, you know the importance of editing and re-writing. The writer must make choices to fit within



certain space requirements or time constraints. I want to share a story that I learned but opted to leave out of my Kol Nidre address (it landed on my cutting room floor) but it still resonates.

The main theme of my Kol Nidre address was how we do what we do as a community is more important than what we do. This became especially evident during a challenging year faced by many of us. Our goal, as a congregation, was (and is) to get the how we do things "right" by acting with integrity, passion, humility, respect and truthfulness. The secondary theme of my address was how our voluntary financial giving supports and protects the long term values of caring, comfort, prayer and education — hallmarks of the Emanuel Synagogue. When preparing my address, I read about how superior organizations succeed and how those qualities may apply to what we do at the Emanuel. I also read about how, in modern day society, we may have strayed from the importance of respecting and living up to the values that important institutions, like the Emanuel, play in our lives.

This story intersects both themes. And it is about what a baseball player, of all people, said upon being inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame. (Even if you are not a baseball fan, keep reading). The player is Ryne Sandberg, a second baseman for the Chicago Cubs from 1982 to 1997. He was a very, very good, but not great, ballplayer.

This is what he said in his induction speech:

"I was in awe every time I walked onto the field. That's respect. I was taught you never, ever disrespect your opponent or your teammates or your organization or your manager and never, ever your uniform. Make a great play, act like you've done it before; get a big hit, look for the third base coach and get ready to run the bases; hit a home run, put your head down, drop the bat, run around the bases, because the name on the front [of your uniform] is a lot more important than the name on the back. That's respect...A lot of people

say this honor today validates my career, but I didn't work hard for validation. I didn't play the game right because I saw a reward at the end of the tunnel. I played it right because that's what you are supposed to do, play it right and with respect...If this validates anything, it's that guys who taught me the game did what they were supposed to do and I did what I was supposed to do."

Although Mr. Sandberg was talking about baseball, his wisdom applies to our daily lives and any worthy endeavor. He knows the importance of respecting those who we connect with, tradition, the work of those who

JEWISH CONTEMPORARY ART THE SUBJECT OF NEW EXHIBIT

The present display in the Rose, David and Ralph Mitnick cases features unique “art as Midrash” by Alan Falk of Huntington, CT. His wide-ranging Jewish art depicts holiday scenes, acts of human kindness, peace. It is a contemporary view of the world through Jewish eyes, contemporary issues through Jewish thought and ideas.

Originally from Manchester, England, where he studied at Manchester College of Art and Design, he was awarded the prestigious Granada Fellowship in Fine Art. His work was included in numerous international exhibitions in the United Kingdom and Europe. Falk spent many years exhibiting in London galleries; also teaching, painting, drawing and print-making.

Arriving in the U.S. in 1974, he became interested in space, nature, the universe and mortality — and later in spirituality. His work often “looks at the Bible and religious thought as a moral and ethical guide, and as a mirror in which to reflect and make decisions about how to live.”

Falk has worked as an illustrator,

graphic designer, and also as art director for a holographic company in Bridgeport. He also worked in digital art for several years. His exhibitions include National Academy of Arts and Letters, Albright-Knox Gallery, Buffalo; Marlborough Fine Arts, New York; New York International Art Expo; Minnesota Museum of Art, Columbus Museum of Art, Bradley University, Peoria; and Sacred Heart University, Fairfield. He has also taught painting and drawing at colleges and Universities in the U.S. and Canada, including the University of New York at Buffalo, and New York University. His works are in many private, corporate, and museum collections worldwide.

Many of Falk’s paintings have Biblical references to the prophets. Of outstanding interest is “Jacob’s Ladder,” with angels ascending and descending, representing the connection between the earthly world and the ascendancy to the spiritual plane.

The scapegoat, “Azazel,” represents the persecution of the Jews for thousands of years. This is a fascinating example of interpretation. The

eyes of the azazel or gripping.

“A Holy Woman in a Landscape” shows the artists’ wife sowing new plants. “The Eternal Will Live Forever” is also a very provocative work.

When we asked the artist what his favorite work is, he informed us that it is “Jacob’s Ladder.” Falk explained that “Jacob’s Ladder” has direct appeal and is a very recognizable image. Also, it is one of the most interpretive images in the Bible.

Why do we use the arts to teach text? Students explore what the text says and what it means to say. Barry Holtz, Professor of Jewish Education at the Jewish Theological Seminary, says, “Given the opportunity to interpret the text by creating their own artistic midrashim, students fulfill the most essential mitzvah of Judaism becoming links in the long chain of those engaged in the interpretation and the teachings of Torah.

The exhibit will remain in the cases until Chanukah, when it will be replaced by unusual groggers and megillah cases. This coming exhibit is a request by Rabbi Philip Lazowski, and our chairperson tries to accommodate every Rabbi’s request.

The display will include items on loan from Emanuel congregants, Beth David, Beth Hillel Synagogues, Tikvah Chadoshah, and Temple Beth El locally; also from the Adath Israel Museum in Middletown, CT.

Assisting Gloria Bein in the setting up of the current exhibit were Joy Platt, Susan Cohn, and the artist Alan Falk.

The Biblical phrasings, affirmations representing the central core of Jewish belief, including service, humility, justice, peace, and the declaration of one G-d makes this exhibit a memorable experience.

Cranberry-Apple Torte

Kosher By Design
Susie Fishbein

Crust:

2 c. all-purpose flour
1 c. margarine, melted
2 c. dark brown sugar
2 tsp. cinnamon
1 ½ c. quick-cooking oatmeal

Filling:

4 Cortland apples, peeled, and diced
16 oz. can whole berry cranberry sauce
2 tbsp. all-purpose flour

Preparation:

Preheat oven to 375°. Heavily coat a 9-inch springform pan with shpritz.

In a large bowl, mix all the Crust ingredients. Reserve 1½ cups of this mixture. Press the remainder into the prepared pan and halfway up the sides with your hands.

In a medium bowl, combine the Filling ingredients. Pour into the crust. Sprinkle the reserved oat mixture over the top. With the back of a spoon, gently press the oats so they cover the top evenly and meet the crust coming up the sides to enclose the filling.

Bake for 40 minutes. Serves 10-12. This goes especially well with turkey.

PARENTING THE CHILD WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Having a child with special needs is not easy, whether that child falls on the autism spectrum, is a “spirited child,” or is simply a round peg in a world that mostly offers square holes to fit in. There are more children than ever before diagnosed with Autism, Aspergers, ADHD, bi-polar disorder, and other cognitive-behavior dysfunctions. The role of a parent of a child with special needs is demanding. Although parents of children with special needs face many challenges, I believe there are four primary challenges that must be met for a family to successfully parent and advocate for their child.

The first challenge to parents of children with special needs is to **avoid denial**. In my experience, although usually both parents will agree that



a child is not doing well, sometimes, there is a parent who would prefer to not accept that a child needs/has a diagnosis. Your child

having special needs is not a reflection that you have failed as a parent. Sometimes a parent is simply unable to deal with the unpleasantness of advocating. Only one parent needs to be the parent advocate. In the spirit of “Shalom Bayit,” it then becomes the non-advocating parent’s role to be supportive: do not allow insecurities, shame, or anger to hinder the advocating parent; listen to and respectfully discuss all the information the advocating parent collects; attend as many school meetings, doctor consultations, and training sessions as you can; and follow through with all home-based educational/behavior modification and teaching directives.

The second challenge to parents of children with special needs is to **get educated**. Which doctors and special-

ists does your child need? Do you need a diagnostician, neurologist, behaviorist, occupational therapist, speech and language therapist, physical therapist, psychologist, psychiatrist, social worker, or reading coach? Do you have a pediatrician, dentist, optometrist, and audiologist with experience providing regular health care to children with your child’s diagnosis (e.g., what if your child is non-verbal, prone to fits of violence, can’t sit through a typical hearing test or dental cleaning, or can’t read a line in the eye chart)? It is important to keep up-to-date on the latest supportive technology and educational tools. It is necessary to keep track of your child’s interfering and pathological behaviors so you, your child, and your child’s doctor can discuss appropriate medication options. It is your responsibility to understand your child’s Individual Education Plan (IEP) or Section 504 accommodation and how it is being implemented in the school. It is essential to listen to and watch your child so you can identify, and help your child identify, their deficits as well as their goals.

The third challenge to parents of children with special needs is to **get organized**. If you have a challenging child, you need a designated filing cabinet to keep ALL your records organized. In addition, for the last eight years I have lived by my 5-subject notebooks. The first section is for anything school-related and includes conversations, lists of things to do, issues to discuss, recommendations to make, thoughts, fears, and telephone conversations. The first page of this section lists names (including official title), phone numbers (including extensions), and emails. I print out emails from school personnel and tape them in this section. The second section is for anything related to medical issues. The first page of this section lists all doctors, specialists, their phone numbers and addresses, and a list of the medications (and dose) my

son is taking. The third section is for all things related to my support network (including conversations with and information from respite providers, friends, our case manager, and the support groups to which I belong). The fourth and fifth sections are used as a journal.

Finally, parents of children with special needs must **find support**. I believe parents need to have empathetic people to talk to about raising challenging children in order to stay sane. The blog board at www.ctfeat.org was my first parental lifeline when our son was diagnosed as being on the autism spectrum. I give huge kudos and hugs to our own Beth Katten (and her family!) for spending the time and effort to keep the Autism Society of Connecticut a source of comfort, education, family-fun activities, and networking. In West Hartford, there is a Special Education PTO that provides interesting, relevant, and free lectures monthly. There is always a schmooze time after the lecture, which I find to be supportive and at least as educational as the lecture. The Bridge Family Center in West Hartford offers parenting classes for parents with a challenging child. **Here at The Emanuel we offer a support group called “Ozreinu”** for parents of children with special needs, which combines the study of Torah with a parent support group atmosphere. I can personally vouch for how inspirational, supportive, and comforting these meetings are. Believe me, you meet the nicest people in parent support groups.

Parenting a child with special needs is not what most of us expected when we dreamed of and planned our family. But I believe parenting a child with special needs offers the opportunity to learn appreciation, patience, gratitude, and the true meaning of unconditional love.

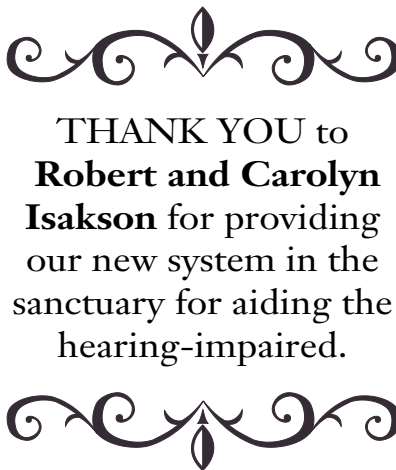
