Nearly 500 people filled the beautiful Emanuel sanctuary for an unforgettable service. After Rabbi Laz's Aliyah, we all sang to him; the words are included below. Three generations of family joined the Emanuel Family to praise and thank Rabbi and Ruth and wish them well. A superb Brotherhood Kiddush was enjoyed by all. A U.S. Senator stopped by, a prominent local cleric added his prayers, there was even a note of blessing from the Vatican! This service and Rabbi's sermon remind us of the power of faith and the importance of reaching out to help another person. Just as the woman who told young Philip, "Take my hand," changed his life with unforeseen positive results, our acts of kindness and generosity can change the world and the lives of others in ways we cannot imagine.

NOTES FROM THE CANTOR — THE POWER OF MUSIC

Since August of this year, I have had the privilege of making monthly visits to the St. Mary Home. Originally established as a retirement home for nuns, this growing institution has expanded considerably in the last several years to become a full-service rehabilitation center and assisted living facility, welcoming and embracing individuals of all faith traditions.



For many years, I was invited to lead Jewish holiday programs there through the year. (I remember fondly one snowy Sunday when children of our Jr. Choir joined me to sing Hanuka songs for the Jewish residents there). Now that the number of Jewish residents has increased, I have been asked to come once a month to lead a short prayer service, with prayers, a short teaching, and songs appropriate to the time of year.

The residents who attend these services are primarily patients suffering with various levels of dementia. While it may be difficult for some of

them to engage in meaningful conversation, or even to read an English prayer, when I start singing a familiar song, like “Oseh Shalom” or “Hevenu Shalom Aleichem,” they invariably sing along with me. Some may only clap their hands or nod their heads, but I can tell that these ditties are reaching pathways to their brains — and their souls — that no discussion or lecture can.

If music — even simple, repetitive Hebrew songs — can reach dementia patients, how much more does music of all kinds reach those of us with all of our faculties? Is it any wonder that music permeates our religious services as well as our home rituals? I know that this is certainly the case for our Emanuel Family. I love to hear the congregation’s voices singing with me in meaningful *t’fila*. During the recent High Holy Days, our choir enhanced and led the voices of the *k’hila*.

A 19th-century English writer, Walter Savage Landor, said, “*Music is God’s gift to man, the only art of Heaven given to earth, the only art of earth we take to Heaven.*”

I couldn’t agree more.

DIANE COHEN: TEACHER FOR 32 YEARS BECOMES A QUILTER

Be sure to view the new exhibit in the Rose, David, and Ralph Mitnick showcases opposite the sanctuary. There you will see the craftsmanship of Diane Cohen of West Hartford.

A native of New Haven, Cohen became an avid quilter after retiring from the local school system. She has crafted over seventy mini quilts, challah and matzah covers. Her mini quilts are made of the finest cotton material. Many of the fronts are machine appliquéd with a top stitch giving the design a three dimensional appearance. Interesting embellishments from assorted materials make many of the challah and matzah covers into mini art quilts suitable for hanging. All of the borders are added using the “stitch in the ditch” technique, with coordinated fabric on the backs creating a very polished, finished touch. Her artistry is perfect for gifts for weddings, bridal showers, how-warming gifts, or just to say “thank you.”

The artist says, “What I like most about quilting is that there is no end to the possibilities. No two of my projects are exactly alike.” She enjoys experimenting and incorporating new ideas and techniques into her work. Her pieces are ever evolving.

Cohen has had a varied career, after graduating from Willimantic State College, majoring in English and Education. She was awarded a Masters Degree in TESOL (Teaching English to Student so other Languages) from New York University).

She has taught in Hartford, and the West Hartford School System, using her skills for students from Kindergarten to Twelfth Grade. She has also taught in the Continuing Education program, coordinated the Adult Mandated Program became coordinator of the Wiremold and Arbor Acres Farm, Inc. ESOL employee programs. She was also on the faculty of St. Joseph’s University.

After taking courses at Central Connecticut University in videography, she created a video production studio at King Philip Middle School with the monies she obtained from grants and the school’s PTO. After retiring, she and the former principal of King Philip School produced a web based series for the West Hartford School System entitled, “Where in the World are They Now,” highlighting the lives of students who graduated from the West Hartford Public School System.

During a hiatus from teaching, while raising her children, she was Dinah the Clown, performing at charity events and children’s birthday parties around the area.

Cohen’s quilted matzah and challah covers will remain on display until the Passover season when it will be replaced by Susan Wolpoe’s collection of Kiddush and Elijah cups, matzah covers, and other Judaica pertaining to Passover. This exhibit will be titled “Passover with Susan Wolpoe.”
