## FROM THE RABBI... A QUESTION OF TIME

**R**osh HaShanah is here. The time passes. The Psalmist asks the Eternal: "Teach us to number our days/that we attain a wise heart" and "Preserve the work of our hands." The turn of the year awakens the question: What does life mean?



My daughters each read a thought-provoking novel, *Night Train to Lisbon*, by Pascal Mercier. One of them shared a passage with me that suits the Season well:

*What does it depend on when we have experienced a month of fulfilled time, our time, instead of a time that has passed us by, which we only suffered, that ran through our fingers, so that it seems to us like a lost, past time, and we're not sad because it's past, but because we couldn't do anything with it? So the question was not how long is a month, but rather: What can you do for yourself with the time of a month? When is it that I have the impression that this month was all mine?... [I]t took me a year to find out*

*what I wanted to know when I posed the...question about the length of a month (p.303).*

Taking stock at the birth of a New Year, we look back and mourn lost time, and also note the time well-spent, the days we bring with us that did not slip between our fingers, but brought with us, held firmly in our grasp, days when we accomplished, created, helped, grew, healed, loved, learned, made peace, made a fresh start, stayed true to our commitments, or simply stood in the wonder and joy of a moment.

The shofar calls, awakening us to take stock of the months that just passed and to reach forward into the newborn world in the months ahead, the New Year. How will we make the time our own?

Debbie, Gabi, Sharone, and Ilan join me in wishing you and all the Emanuel Family *Leshanah Tovah Tikateivu v'Teikhateimu* — May you be written and sealed in the Book of Life for a good and sweet year!

## NOTES FROM THE CANTOR

As is often my habit this time of year, I recently reviewed articles that I've written for synagogue bulletins throughout my career. I noticed that, exactly six years ago, in 2007, I wrote in what used to be called *The Emanuel News* that we were about to embark upon a new style for our services on the Second Day of Rosh Hashana. That year we instituted the practice of giving the choir and organ a rest and using the voices of the *k'hila* (congregation) to be my musical accompaniment to the *t'filot*. This experiment proved to be a resounding (pun intended) success, and we have maintained this style for the Second Day as well as for the *N'ila* service on Yom Kippur ever since.



Rabbi Small and I, in partnership with the Ritual Committee, are always evaluating our services, striving to find the best configuration of cantor, choir and accompaniment to suit our congregation's spiritual needs. This year, for the First Day of Rosh Hashana, Kol Nidrei, and Yom Kippur Day, our plan is to bring the organ and choir downstairs to the bima and floor levels so that they are more a part of the congregation, rather than a separate entity up in the choir loft. In this way we hope that those in the *k'hila* who are inspired to will sing and pray with the choir and me, and those who prefer to sit back and listen can do so as well. As with any experiment, we would love to hear or read your feedback and reactions to this new arrangement once we have all had a chance to experience it. It is my hope that our High Holy Day services will be inspirational and fulfilling to all, and that we will all be blessed with a *Shana Tova uM'tuka*.

## THE WORKS OF HANS STARGARDTER, SCULPTOR

**B**e sure to view the new exhibit in the Rose, David, and Ralph Mitnick showcases opposite the sanctuary. There you will see the works of Hans Stargardter, a fine metal smith from Bloomfield.

Stargardter is a Holocaust survivor whose family left Germany in 1939, nine months after Kristallnacht, when he was only twelve years old. His family went to Guatemala where they had distant family. After spending a year in school to learn Spanish, his parents sent him to an ornamental iron shop as an apprentice, where he remained for three years. He finally got to go to high school and worked as a hotel desk clerk. The secretary of Florida Southern College found him when the school had a summer session in Guatemala, and he was awarded a full work scholarship to FSC. A new life and a new career were born!

The three years spent in the ornamental iron shop as a youth initiated a lifelong love for beautiful forms made of metal. In his retirement, Stargardter returned to his metal craft after working forty years as an engineer. He spent three summers in workshops with metal masters followed by twenty years of creating original work.

His has shown his work in many exhibits including the Invitational Exhibit at the University of Connecticut Health Center and elsewhere around Connecticut. He has given workshops for teachers at the Wadsworth Atheneum, at the Bruce Museum in Greenwich, and has taught at the Brookfield Craft Center.

In May 2012, upon learning of the passing of children's author Maurice Sendak, Stargardter memorialized Sendak

with an exhibit of his pieces of sculpture depicting characters from Sendak's book *Where the Wild Things Are*.

Stargardter's sculptures are primarily formed of sheet metal using brass, pewter, and silver, employing special hammers and anvils to stretch the sheet into a multitude of shapes.

There are nineteen pieces of sculpture exhibited in our showcases. Please take note of *The Burning Bush*, created in pewter, brass, and silver, a *chanukiah*, and Shabbat candlesticks in pewter. Of great interest is *Red Sea Parting* in copper. Rounding out the collection are *Kalanchoa Flowers* in brass and copper on wood and *Calla Lillies Bouquet* in the clay pot in brass, copper, and pewter.
